#### 1. Call to Order

# 4. Reports

# 4.1. President's Report

- Al expressed his thanks to a number of groups and individuals:
  - To the Club executive and all the league reps who attended board meetings throughout the year, for their time and effort to make the club a success.
  - To the volunteers that helped with Learn to Curl and the Rookie league
  - To Doug Muir for our excellent website
  - To Al Sutherland and the ice crew
  - To the Township of Esquimalt
  - To the maintenance staff
- Esquimalt Curling Club is giving back to the community with the Charity Spiel and donations from leagues to local charities.
- The total number of league members (nearly 700) increased this year, with 105 sheets of ice in use per week.
  - Over 100 new curlers this season includes Wheelchair league, Learn to Curl, Rookie League, new teams, and people returning after time away
  - Leagues are filling up which could become a problem if we cannot accommodate new curlers. Need to start thinking of new leagues, perhaps on weekends.
  - Al has discussed with the Doubles League the idea of incorporating Stick Doubles into the league to help fill the league. Al is still in discussions with Esquimalt about getting a Doubles league rate.
- ECC hire Al Sutherland to map the rocks over the summer in 2024.
  - He found that the rocks are near the end of their lifespan.
  - Al T. has had discussions with Esquimalt about replacing the rocks. It will likely be a multi-year project.

If ECC can help offset the cost of replacing the rocks by donating funds, will speed up the process.
There are various fundraising opportunities that can be explored.

# • <u>Learn to Curl (LTC)/Rookie League</u>

- ECC partnered with the township. Esquimalt looked after advertising, registration, collection of fees, and paid for ice rental. ECC supplied course content, equipment, and instruction. 60/40 revenue split in ECC's favour.
- Limited to 24 students. Had 5-7 volunteers
- o 2/3 of LTC participants joined the Rookie League.
- o Rookie league had 40 participants with <3 years experience.
- o Fall 2025 will run 3 sheets (24 students) of LTC at same time as Rookie League (3 sheets)
- Winter 2026 will incorporate LTC students into Rookie league (6 sheets)
- Need more volunteers
- o Amanda Lynn Ballard has agreed to take over running LTC & Rookie League

#### Provincial Championships 2026

- o Curl BC has asked ECC to host the Mens' & Women's provincial championships again.
- o Championships will be held Dec 30, 2025 Jan 4, 2026.
- ECC will work with the township of Esquimalt. Victoria Curling Club will not be a co-host.
- Township of Esquimalt would like to see more events at Archie Browning, and provincial championships are good advertising. Would like to see local businesses benefit.
- Still have some money left over from co-hosting 2024 championships, expect higher returns this time. Money could be put towards new rocks.

#### • Charity Bonspiels

- The senior men's bonspiel has been turned into a co-ed charity bonspiel. Over \$3000 has been raised and given back to local charities.
- o Pei Me Chi is starting a Curl for the Cure bonspiel, likely to be held in mid-October.

#### 4.2. Treasurer's Report

- The Treasurer's position was vacant this season, so Al T. took on the responsibilities.
- Financial statements and the proposed 20025-26 Operating Budget were distributed to those in attendance prior to the start of the AGM.
- Expenses were similar to last year with the exception of equipment (rock mapping/ Nipper blades). Board agreed to spend approximately ¼ of profit from hosting the provincials to benefit the club.
- Thank you to Len Hanishuk for his work on sponsorship.
- The Youth League would like to thank Bill Haddon and the Victoria Optimists for their donation of \$1000 which allowed the league to buy new helmets. Rachel requested that they be added to the sponsorship board.
- Mavis Smith, Matt Broughton, and Pam Knyph conducted a financial review. Based on that review, the financial statements are recommended for approval.
- Motion: Approve Esquimalt Curling Club's financial statements for the 2024-25 fiscal year.

#### 5. Budget 2023-24

- Forecasting a small increase in membership for the 2025-26 season.
- Curling Canada fees will increase. Total CurlBC/Curling Canda fee = \$37
